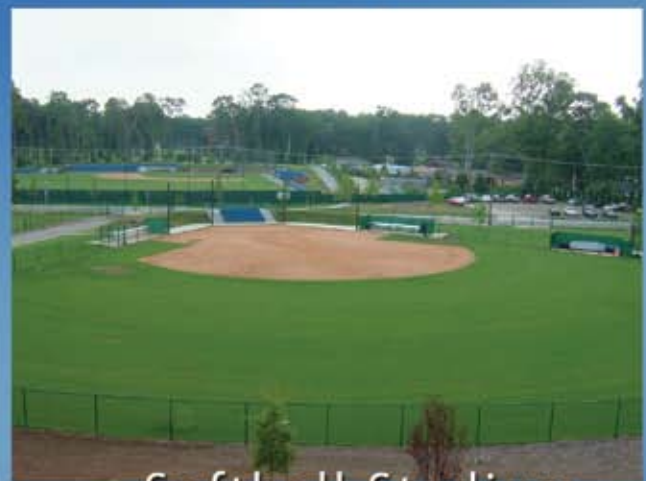

THE COACHING STAFF

HEAD COACH STEVE SHAW

When Steve Shaw arrived at Christopher Newport in 1996, one of his main goals was to rebuild the Captains' soccer team into a nationally prominent program. He accomplished this in 2000 when he took his squad to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

By advancing to the Elite Eight, Shaw accomplished something that no other CNU athletic team had ever done at that time.

The Captains posted their best record in history in 2000, going 18-3-1, playing another power-packed schedule.

The Dixie Conference recognized his efforts once again by naming him Coach of the Year.

CNU also had another first in its soccer history, the first ever night game. With the addition of lights, and one of the finest facilities around, CNU was able to host its first three NCAA Tournament games in 2000.

Shaw took his squad back to the NCAA Tournament in 2006, when his squad re-

ceived an at-large bid. The Captains won their first game but lost in the second round.

A native of Marshfield, Massachusetts, Shaw came to CNU in 1996 following six seasons as an assistant at William & Mary. His first team at CNU surprised everyone by going 13-5, just one year after the program had suffered through a 5-11 season. That squad cracked the NCAA South Region Top 10 for the first time in many years.

Shaw's imprint on the William & Mary program is evident by the fact the team went 86-32-14 in his six seasons there. Shaw was one of the key architects that turned the program into a national power.

Shaw can also be seen working with young people throughout the Tidewater community, mentoring young soccer players from the inner city as well as the Virginia Legacy Soccer Club.

He has also made two trips to Africa where he has conducted clinics and donated soccer equipment while working with the International

Young Life Organization and working with kids in Honduras.

In 12 seasons, Shaw has amassed an overall record of 150-72-10, by far the best record in men's soccer history at CNU. His coaching career has spanned 30 years and has produced a record of 335-140-40.

Shaw was also an outstanding player at Morehead State, where he was nominated for All-America honors.

He spent two years with the LaLiga Alajuelense Youth Reserve team in Costa Rica and played for the Kentucky Kickers, the state's amateur champions.

After earning his bachelor's degree, Shaw earned his masters from Eastern Kentucky. He is fluent in Spanish and also has a working knowledge of French, Portuguese and Italian.

Shaw and his wife Alice reside in Newport News, VA.

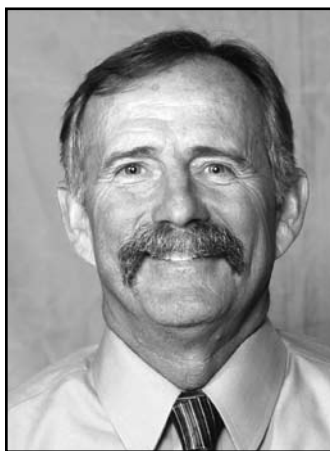

Another one of head coach Steve Shaw's former players returns for his seventh season as an assistant coach.

Ryan Hagerty, a Virginia Beach, VA, native, was

instrumental in the Captains' run to the Elite Eight in 2000. He anchored a defense that allowed just 18 goals in 22 games. Hagerty finished his three-year CNU career with three goals.



He led his team to a state championship in high school, and also garnered First Team All-Beach District as well as first team all-state honors while at Kempsville H.S..

Hagerty is currently an eighth grade History teacher at Crittenden Middle School in Newport News.

JUSTIN CHEZEM ASSISTANT COACH

Chezem returns to CNU for his second season as an assistant, and his first in a full-time manner. He, too, was a four-year player for Head Coach Steve Shaw from 2001-2004.

Chezem helped the Captains to a combined 48-25-6 record during his tenure in a CNU uniform. He was a First Team All-USA South pick as a senior in 2004. In 2003, Chezem was again a First Team All-Conference pick, named to the USA South's All-Tournament Team and was also a Third Team All-South pick.



Chezem graduated with a degree in Business Marketing and has also coached locally at Warwick High School.

LOOKING BACK AT 2007

Some may call 11-7 a good year. That vernacular isn't in the vocabulary of Head Coach Steve Shaw. In his 12 seasons, Shaw has won at least 10 games each and every season.

The program's all-time winningest coach with 150 wins might think 11 wins in a season is a "down" year.

Shaw is also never one to shy away from playing any of the tougher teams in the nation. The 2007 season saw Messiah, which has won countless national championships, make a trip to Newport News, along with national powers the College of New Jersey, VA Wesleyan, Roanoke, St. Mary's and NC Wesleyan.

Shaw also traveled to York (PA), which has danced for several straight years. CNU also traveled to nationally ranked Salisbury.

The downside to the season could very well have been the 1-0 loss to Methodist in the USA South Tournament semifinals. The Captains, who finished 5-1 in conference play and in second place, received a bye into the semifinals. The Monarchs scored the game's only goal in the 44th minute, despite being out-shot by Christopher Newport, 11-7.

One bright spot in 2007 was the play of Michael Caro. The senior scored 20 goals and finished with 41 points for the year. He was named the USA South's Player of the Year and First Team All-Conference and second team all-South.

Caro's 20 goals were the second most in a single season in school history. His 41 points were also the third most in a single season.

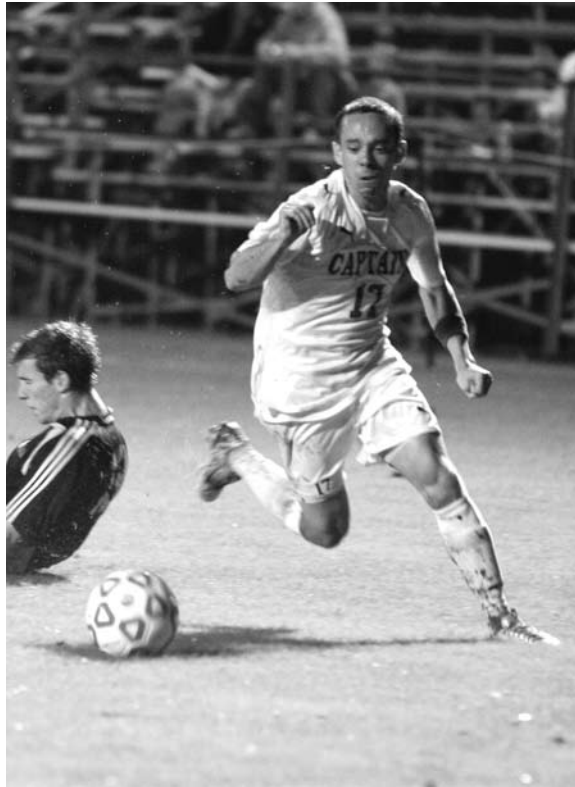
Brian Tweed, who scored seven goals and assisted on three others was also named First Team All-USA South. Tweed was second on the team in both goals and points. Caro and Tweed were joined on the First Team by two of the Captains four defenders, and its keeper.

Bryan Davis and Matt Page, both defenders, earned First Team accolades. Goalkeeper Matt Tengs, who was the conference's Rookie of the Year in 2006, also was selected to the First Team.

Freshman forward Tyler Clare was named Second Team All-USA South. He was third on the team in goals with six and points with 15. Senior defender Shawn Trueblood also was named Second Team All-USA South.

Davis was named to the All-Sportsmanship squad and defender Kevin Greenberg was named All-Tournament.

Caro was a Second Team All-South Region pick for his performance in 2007.

Caro and Page were also honored as First Team All-State selections. Tweed and Davis were named Second Team All-State.

The Captains began the year hosting the VCAM/CNU Classic where they defeated Eastern Mennonite before falling to Messiah on day two. The following week, CNU once again hosted a tournament, the Joe Pombriant/CNU Classic. The College of New Jersey escaped with a 4-3 win over the Captains on day one. CNU rebounded to drop Kean, 8-1, on day two.

Christopher Newport hit the road for three straight contests, losing at York (PA), and taking the next two, defeating

Villa Julie (now Stevenson) and Division II University of the District of Columbia.

CNU returned home to take on its cross-water rival, VA Wesleyan, a game the Marlins won 2-1.

After the loss to VA Wesleyan, CNU reeled off six straight wins. The Captains defeated Averett, Ferrum, Shenandoah, Methodist, Roanoke and Greensboro.

Nationally-ranked Salisbury snapped CNU's six-match winning streak with a 5-3 win. Christopher Newport returned home, defeated St. Mary's in the team's final non-conference game, 1-0.

The Captains final regular season home match came against rival NC Wesleyan. The winner would get the top seed and the right to host the USA South Tournament, the Bishops knocked off the Captains, 2-1.

The loss set up the semifinal match-up. Methodist defeated Ferrum 2-0 in the quarterfinals.

THE OUTLOOK FOR 2008



Head Coach Steve Shaw likes to keep his roster anywhere between 20-25. The 2008 team boasts 29 players. Of those 29, ten are seniors and 14 are incoming freshmen.

Once again, Shaw returns almost his whole starting defense, including his goalkeeper. Gone are the 20 goals Michael Caro scored in 2007. But Shaw has plenty of capable players who are able to find the back of the net.

Despite returning 15 players, including seven starters from a year ago, the Captains were picked to finish third in the USA South preseason poll.

CNU will play its usual high-powered schedule in 2008 as they play eight teams that participated in the NCAA tournament in 2007.

Four All Conference players will return to lead CNU in the 2007 Season.

The biggest challenge for the Captains will be to replace Caro's 20 goals scored, which accounted for 38% of CNU's scoring.

GOALKEEPERS

Matt Tengs (Springfield, VA, West Springfield H.S.), a junior, returns for his third season. He finished 8-7 with four shutouts and a 1.56 GAA in 2007 and was a First Team All-USA South selection. Tengs will be backed up by freshman **Justin Wolfe (Williamsburg, VA, Lafayette H.S.)**. Wolfe had a fantastic high school career where he was an All-State, Region and District pick.

DEFENDERS

Last year, all four defenders returned, this season, three of the four are back. **Bryan Davis (Barhamsville, VA, New Kent H.S.)**, who began last season in the midfield, and eventually moved back to defense, will anchor the back line. He was a First Team All-Conference and a Second Team All-State pick in 2007. Junior **Kevin Greenberg (Fairfax Station, VA, Hayfield H.S.)** is back as is senior **James Nugent (Pocomoke, MD, Pocomoke H.S.)** on the left side. CNU's defense from last year allowed just 24 goals in 18 games. Sophomore **Chris Thome (Montclair, VA, Forest Park H.S.)** should slide in as the fourth starter. Look for senior **Casey Glancy (Fairfax, VA, Fairfax H.S.)** to see some time on defense.

Shaw has also brought in several freshman who will be looked upon as capable reserves. **David Haas (Newport News, VA, Menchville H.S.)**, **Ted Faris (Alexandria, VA, Robinson H.S.)**, **Trevor Moyer (Suffolk, VA, Nansemond River H.S.)**, **Michael Platt (Yorktown, VA, Tabb H.S.)** and **Mark Fales (Poolesville, MD, Poolesville H.S.)** could all see action throughout the season.

MIDFIELDERS

The midfield is deep and experienced with three seniors set to start and the fourth is a junior. **Kyle Allan (Fairfax, VA, Fairfax H.S.)**, a senior, who has been a three-year starter, will anchor the middle with **Jimmy Hash (Montclair, VA, Forest Park H.S.)**. Both are defensive specialists who have the ability to get the ball up in transition into the offensive third.

Outside speed demons **Brian Tweed (Springfield, VA, West Springfield)** and **John Corser (Burke, VA, Lake Braddock H.S.)** have the inside track on the flanks. Tweed returns for his senior year after scoring seven goals in 2007 and should solidify the outside left while Corser, a junior, saw considerable action last year on the right side.

Numerous newcomers could also see time in the midfield.

Clif Kipper (Hayes, VA, Gloucester H.S.), a freshman, who missed last year with an injury, could very well provide a spark off the bench. **Kramer Runager (Williamsburg, VA, Jamestown H.S.)**, **Nao Masuda (Radford, VA, Radford H.S.)**, **Danny Franklin (Williamsburg, VA, Jamestown H.S.)**, **Brian Lybert (Honolulu, HI, Woodbridge (VA) H.S.)**, and **Nathan Roberts (Colonial Heights, VA, Colonial Heights H.S.)** are also very capable of coming off the bench for Shaw.

FORWARDS

Gone is last year's leading scorer, Michael Caro, and his 20 goals. Returning are several players who have the ability to finish. **Brock Hughes (Williamsburg, VA, Lafayette H.S.)** returns and is fully recovered from his various injuries that allowed him to only play in a handful of games in 2007. **Kenny Huttman (Reston, VA, Herndon H.S.)** returns for his senior year and will definitely be looked upon to provide an offensive spark off the bench. The second starting forward position is up for grabs and it could go to Huttman, senior speedster **James Majewski (Prince George, VA, Price George H.S.)**, **Tyler Clare (Williamsburg, VA, Jamestown H.S.)**, who was a Second Team All-USA South pick last year, or freshman **Winston Mattheisen (Norfolk, VA, Jamestown H.S.)**. Senior **Andrew Carver (Lottsburg, VA, Christchurch H.S.)**, who can play forward and midfield and freshman **Steven Farmer (Poquoson, VA, Poquoson H.S.)** could also see time.

SCHEDULE

Shaw has put together another loaded schedule, which once again ranks in the top 10 toughest schedules in the nation. To start the 2008 campaign, the Captains will play in three consecutive tournaments, with the first and third coming at home. The Second Annual VCAM/CNU Classic

returns as the Captains have invited **Medaille, York (PA)** and **VA Wesleyan**. CNU opens the year by facing Medaille and concludes the tournament playing York. The following weekend, CNU hits the road for Ohio where they will play in the Marietta College Classic. The Captains will play **Westminster** and then play either **Marietta** or **Walsh** on day two. The final tournament of the year, the Joe Pombriant/CNU Classic, will be held Sept. 13-14. Shaw has brought in the **College of New Jersey, New Jersey City**, and **Methodist**.

After the third tournament, CNU hits the road for five matches. The Captains will play at **VA Wesleyan, Mary Washington** and **Roanoke** and then fly to Texas to play **Southwestern** and **Trinity**.

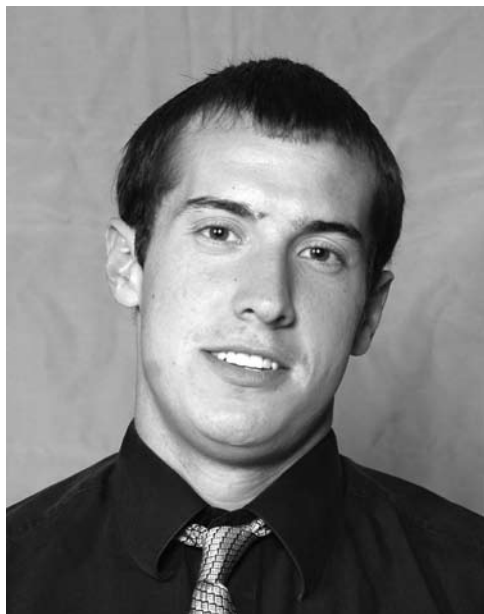

THE HISTORY OF THE USA SOUTH

The USA South Athletic Conference, formerly known as the Dixie Conference, was formed in 1963 when six schools with similar philosophies of academics and athletics joined as the founding members. These colleges were: Charlotte College (presently UNC Charlotte), College of Charleston (S.C.), Methodist College, Lynchburg College, North Carolina Wesleyan College and St. Andrews Presbyterian College. The basis of the new athletic conference was that participation would be strictly amateur, thus no athletically related financial aid or athletic scholarships would be awarded. This philosophy still exists today.

The conference was originally affiliated with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), and remained with that affiliation until 1973. At that time the NCAA formed the Division III concept, which allowed membership only for non-athletic scholarship schools. The Dixie Conference joined this new arrangement, and in so doing, it became one of the first conferences to be accepted in Division III. From the beginning of the Division, the Dixie Conference has been a leader in many areas, and has gained an outstanding reputation, regionally and nationally.

The conference sponsored athletic programs for men students only until 1983. The NCAA expanded its sponsorship to include women's programs on the Division III level in that year, and the Dixie Conference followed that lead by also including women's sports. Many of the members' teams have gained excellent recognition in these sports.

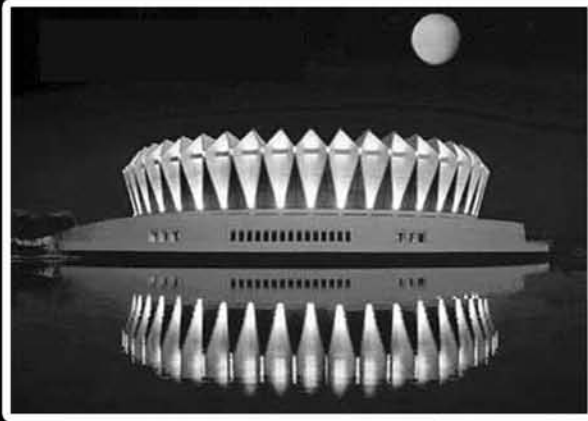
Each year the conference not only recognizes the participants for outstanding athletic achievements, but academic achievements are also emphasized. Those student athletes who maintain academic averages of 3.0 or better are named to the All-Academic team. This group annually averages well over 300 in number.

The Dixie Conference recently was renamed in 2003 to the USA South Athletic Conference.

The conference is presently led by Commissioner Rita Wiggs and President John Hill, of Shenandoah University.

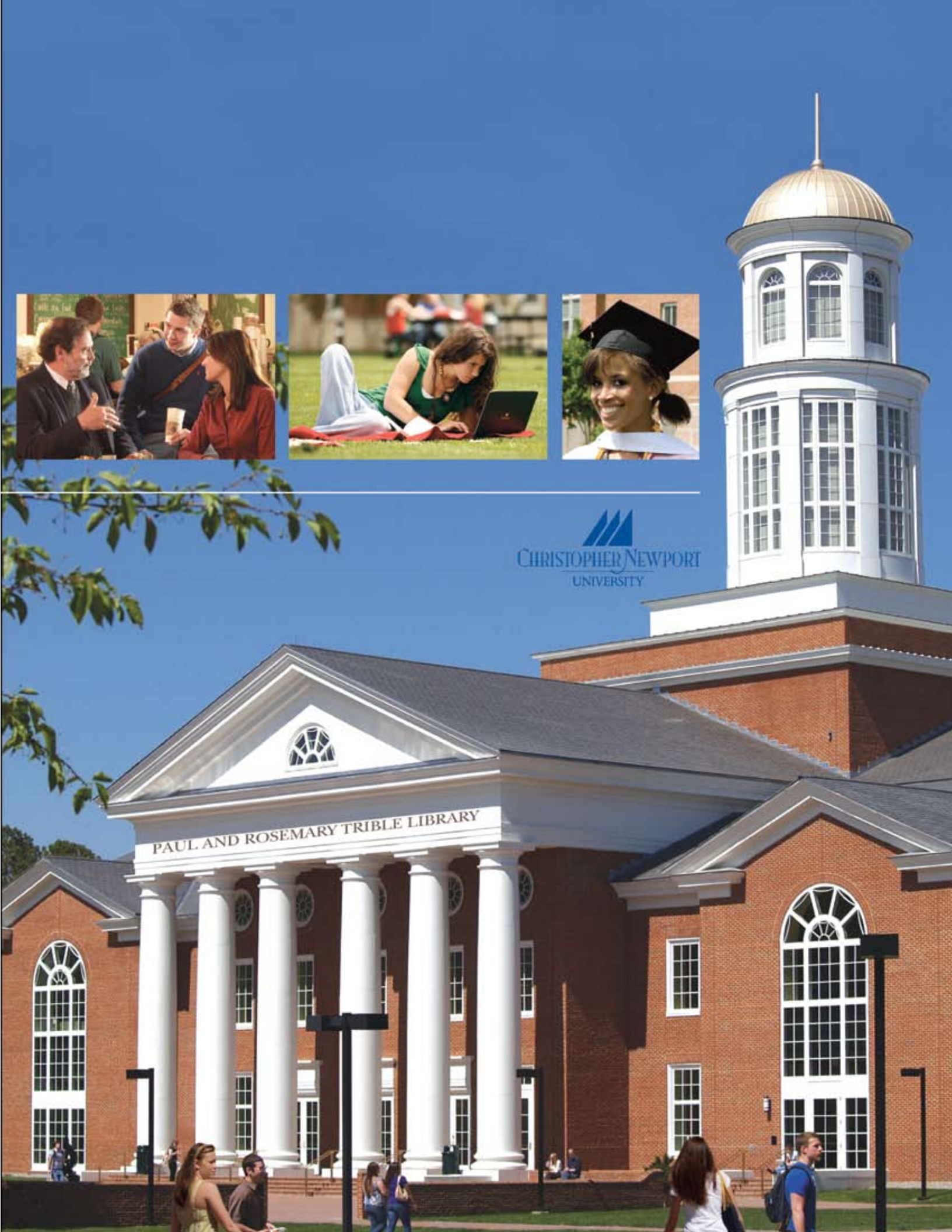
