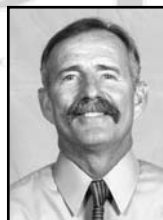

HEAD COACH RUSH COLE



The winningest men's tennis coach in CNU history, Rush Cole enters his 12th season at the helm and has a record of 123-69 after going 13-8 in 2007.

Cole has been the architect of one the best stretches in program history as he led his team to the USA South Conference regular season and tournament championships in 2006 and tournament finals in 2007. The 2006 title was the first such tournament championship since CNU tied for the title in 1993 and the first outright title win since 1990. Cole was a member of that team.

Cole is a former CNU player, from 1988-91, and had a great career, especially in doubles. His career record in doubles of 55-19 is fifth best all-time at CNU, and his 55 wins are tied for second place for the most doubles victories. In 1990 he teamed with Holden Knight for a 21-2 mark.

He is a graduate of nearby Phoebus H.S. where he was a state semi-finalist in his junior year and team MVP as a senior.

The Dixie Conference recognized him as Coach of the Year in 1998 and 1999, and he was also chosen Coach of the Year in 2005 in the renamed USA South.

ASSISTANT COACH WORTH RICHARDSON

Worth Richardson enters his second season as an assistant coach. Richardson was a former four-year starter for head coach Rush Cole.

As a player, he received all-USA South honors and helped lead his team to its first conference title in over a decade. He finished his bachelor's degree in Economics at Christopher Newport last May.

Richardson works with many of the area's top junior tennis players and works as a tennis pro at James River Country Club.

He enjoys spending time being active in his hometown community of Culpeper, VA, spending time with family and friends, sports, and playing with his dog, Protis.



ASSISTANT COACH ERIC CHRISTIANSEN

Former University of North Florida tennis star Eric Christiansen returns to the CNU coaching staff after a brief absence.

Christiansen was the captain of the Ospreys who were ranked No. 15 in the nation in Division II.

He was regionally ranked in singles and was in the Top 20 nationally in doubles.

In addition, he was an all-conference player.

Christiansen was a part of head coach Rush Cole's staff in 2004 and 2005, helping guide an improvement from a 7-7 record in 2004 to a 12-4 mark the following year.

He currently coaches and competes throughout the Mid-Atlantic Region.

A REVIEW OF 2007

Facing the Best

Christopher Newport's 13-8 men's tennis record in 2007 certainly wasn't the best in school history, but if you factor in exactly who the Captains played, a good argument could be made for calling last year's team the best ever at CNU.

Coach Rush Cole purposely set up a very challenging schedule for a team he knew had loads of potential.

The Captains eventually played eight matches against teams ranked either nationally or regionally, winning two.

The victories came against number 11 Washington (Md.), 5-4, CNU's first win ever over the Shoremen, and 5-4 over Oglethorpe, ranked No. 14 at the time.

CNU, itself, was ranked 12th at the end of the year after being as high as 10th.

Honoring the Captains

At the end of the year, CNU's John Mook and Eddie Glidewell both received individual honors.

Mook was named first team all-USA South, as well as first team all-Virginia

Division II-III.

Glidewell received the same two awards, and was included on the USA South all-tournament team.

On to Nationals

Mook and Glidewell, both juniors, combined for a 16-4 record at No. 1

doubles for CNU and were rewarded with a trip to the NCAA Division III National Championships.

The pair fell to Charlie Cutler and Chris Hoeland, of host Washington University, 6-3, 6-2, but gained valuable national experience.

PREVIEW OF THE 2008 SEASON

With four freshmen likely to crack what is already a veteran lineup, Christopher Newport men's tennis coach Rush Cole is anticipating the 2008 season as much, or more, as any in his 12-year career.

Those freshmen won't be bursting into an inferior lineup. Cole has two seniors at the top who will finish their CNU careers among the best ever to play for the Captains, and three other veterans who had fine seasons a year ago.

"This group of freshmen is the best I've ever had," notes Cole whose lineup last year usually included three first year players.

But everything starts at the top with seniors John Mook and Eddie Glidewell.

Both are making an assault on the CNU record book.

Mook begins the year with a 41-11 career singles record and is ranked 12th in the South Region.

Glidewell sports a 44-15 career singles mark and is No. 17 in the pre-season rankings.

As a doubles team they were 16-4 last season and earned a spot in the NCAA Division III National Championships.

Because of that they have been ranked No. 5 in the South Region at the start of the year.

Mook finished 2007 playing at No. 1 and Glidewell at No. 2, and that is where they are likely to begin 2008.

Their presence at the top of the Christopher Newport lineup is the reason the Captains were ranked No. 11 in the pre-season South Region poll.

Cole is especially excited because as juniors both faced numerous ranked opponents which should bode well as they head into the 2008 season.

Also returning from last year's starting lineup are three young players who had their first CNU experience a year ago.

Junior John Braig transferred from Mary Washington and stepped into the No. 3 slot in the 2007 CNU lineup. He posted a 13-7 total singles record and was 5-1 in USA South play. Braig also

teamed with Steve Myers as the No. 2 doubles team. They were 7-11 for the season.

Sophomore Dylan Young manned the No. 4 singles slot most of the season with a 9-12 total record. He was 4-2 against USA South competition.

Myers played No. 5 singles just about all year and had a 10-10 total singles mark.

The No. 6 singles position was the only senior on last year's squad, David Weiner, who finished 7-9 overall.

He and Young were a strong No. 3 doubles team with a 10-6 record, plus a 3-0 mark at No. 2.

Senior Kevin Repper also filled in at No. 5 and 6 singles with a combined 4-2 record including 4-0 in the USA South.

Sophomore Chris Scott won his two No. 6 singles opportunities and paired with Repper for a 2-0 No. 3 doubles mark.

But Cole notes that it is entirely possible that all four of his freshmen might hold down the No. 3-6 singles slots.

Jacob Braig, younger brother of John Braig, was an outstanding player at nearby Jamestown High School, as was Lorenzo Sison.

In addition, Ricky Connor, a regionally-ranked player from Yorktown H.S. in Alexandria, Va., and Dusty Nelson, who was unbeaten in singles during the regular season at Maple Grove H.S. in Bemus Point, N.Y., will all compete to break into the lineup.

"This is the most mature new group of guys we have ever had," says Cole, knowing that it will need to be to handle the demands of a schedule he says, "is as tough, or maybe tougher than last season. But we're much better prepared to face it," he adds.

CNU won the USA South title in 2006, but that was a year before the conference received an automatic bid to the NCAA Championships.

Last season the Captains fell to Methodist in the conference title match. They are looking forward to another shot at their first-ever NCAA berth.

Home of Champions

Few, if any, Division III schools have had the overall success of the Christopher Newport athletic program.

Through the end of the 2006-07 season, CNU teams had won 12 national championships, either won or shared 150 conference titles and have produced an amazing number of individual accomplishments.

CNU athletes have won All-America recognition an amazing 516 times and have captured 64 individual national championships.

In the USA South Athletic Conference, CNU has won ten consecutive President's Cups and 16 of the last 24. Statewide, in Virginia, Christopher Newport has had the best win-loss record of any school in the state for six of the last ten years.

Nationally, CNU teams have made 59 NCAA appearances since 1982, not counting hundreds of individuals in track, cross country and golf.

Fast Facts

Christopher Newport University is a small, selective public university. It offers baccalaureate programs through its College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the Joseph W. Luter, III School of Business, which earned international accreditation in 2005 by the world's top business accrediting organization – the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business. The University also offers a five-year bachelor's to masters program in teaching and graduate programs in applied physics and computer science and environmental science.

Location

CNU's 260-acre campus is located in Newport News, Va., two and a half hours south of Washington, D.C., less than an hour from Williamsburg and Virginia Beach, and just a few blocks from where the tidal James River flows into the Chesapeake Bay.

Student Profile

Forty-five percent of CNU's 4,800 students are male; 55 percent are female. Students come to CNU from every region in Virginia, 32 other states, and several foreign nations. The average high school GPA is 3.4 (on a 4.0 scale). The average SAT score is 1165 (critical reading and math sections).

History

Founded in 1960 as a two-year branch of the College of William and Mary, CNU became independent in 1977 and gained university status in 1991. Today, CNU is the youngest comprehensive university in the Commonwealth.

Class Size

With an average class size of 25 students, CNU has much smaller classes than most state universities. More than 90 percent of classes are seminars, and no classes are taught by graduate teaching assistants.

Facilities

With a \$400 million building campaign nearly complete, CNU's campus is bursting with new buildings and

improvements. Recent additions include state-of-the-art residential facilities, a \$16 million sports and convocation center, the new Ferguson Center for the Arts, and residential facility restaurants and stores. Opening in fall 2006 is a state-of-the-art student union; and an expansion project that will double the size of CNU's library is scheduled for completion in fall 2007.

Ferguson Center for the Arts

The \$60 million Ferguson Center for the Arts is the crowning jewel of Christopher Newport University. Teaching and learning are celebrated in the 1,700-seat Concert Hall, 440-seat Music and Theatre Hall, 200-seat Studio Theatre, classrooms, sound-isolated music practice spaces, rehearsal halls, dance studios, costume shops, lighting labs and set design studios. The Center's inaugural season, which began in September 2005, included world-class classical, pop, Broadway and dance performances, attracting more than 120,000 patrons and ticket revenue in excess of \$3.2 million.

Athletics

CNU athletes compete in 21 NCAA sports, including football, lacrosse and sailing. The University ranks fifth nationally in NCAA Division III Team Championships, and the school has produced 500 All-Americans.

Residence Halls

Nearly 3,000 students are housed in the University's state-of-the-art residential facilities that include four new resi-

dence halls and two new apartment complexes that win raves from students and parents, as well as architectural awards. New residential living includes CNU Village, a unique mixed-use development on campus that houses restaurants and stores that serve the entire community as well as students, faculty and staff. Every residential room has high-speed Internet, basic satellite cable TV, digital local phone service, 24-hour security, and electronic room access. All rooms are equipped with a microwave and mini-refrigerator or have kitchen access.

Faculty

Eighty-five percent of CNU's 932 faculty members hold the Ph.D. or highest degree in their fields. Fifty-five new faculty members have been added since 2003.

Cost

For in-state, full-time undergraduates, tuition and fees are \$6,460, and room and board is \$8,100. Christopher Newport University offers a variety of financial aid programs to help students and their parents pay for college; 43 percent of students receive some form of aid.

Campus Life

CNU's 100 clubs and organizations include academic organizations, fraternities and sororities, and special-interest groups. From Altered Xpressionz to Vibes of Our Vernacular, students are sure to find something to spark their interests.



Outstanding teaching with a strong commitment to undergraduate education and the liberal studies core are the hallmarks of Christopher Newport University. A dramatic transformation spanning the past decade has placed it among the United States' pre-eminent liberal arts universities. As the youngest university in the Commonwealth of Virginia's excellent system of higher education, CNU is getting better, not bigger.

CNU offers an unbeatable combination of great teaching, small classes and a commitment to placing students first, which means that the quality of teaching, advising and student life is the University's first concern. Classes average only 25 students, and are taught by faculty members – 85 percent of which hold a doctorate or the highest degree in their field – not teaching assistants. These scholars desire to engage and challenge students inside and outside the classroom and are committed to playing an active role in campus life.
