HEAD COACH

FIFTH SEASON AS CNU HEAD COACH

It didn't take long for Keith Parr to make a big splash in Division III softball coaching.

In his first year as head coach of the Christopher Newport program, in 2004, Parr directed his team to a 36-7 record, the best in school history. The Lady Captains were ranked in the Top 25 in the nation most of the year, at one point as high as sixth.

The Lady Captains swept to the USA South regular season championship with a 15-1 record. For his efforts he was named conference Coach of the Year in his first season at the helm. He also received the same honor from the Virginia Sports Information Directors for Divisions II and III in Virginia.

In 2007 Parr directed the Captains back to the NCAA Tournament and a 34-10 record. In the first round of the event CNU defeated the defending Division III national champions, Rutgers-Camden, 10-3.

Along with the outstanding record, Parr had a chance to help in the development of two All-America players. Dallas Slosjarik was named first team All-America by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, the first time CNU has had a first team pick. Lauren Batson earned second team honors, also a first at CNU.

Parr graduated in 1999 from Christopher Newport with a degree in Recreation, Sports, and Wellness Management.

He had been an assistant under former head coach Paul Weiss for four years. The CNU graduate and former baseball player helped lead the Lady Captains to a 131-38-2 record during those seasons. That was the most successful four-year stretch in CNU softball history at the time.

At CNU, he played four years of baseball for head coach Curt Long. During his senior year, Parr had a 2.66 earned run average, leading the team in that category. He recorded five wins in 12 appearances, including five starts. Opponents hit a cool .217 off him that year as well.

He was instrumental in organizing and founding a successful team in the Tidewater Collegiate Summer Baseball League in which he was a player/coach for three years.

Parr coached for the Virginia Legends, an ASA Junior Olympic traveling team for two years. He also was involved as an instructor for numerous collegiate baseball and softball camps.

He worked for the Virginia Roadsters of the Women's Professional Softball League in the summer of 1999.

CNU softball is definitely a family affair for him. He is married to former Lady Captain player Joy Davison. They have a son Drew that just turned six, and a daughter Jordan, who is almost three.

Bailey has coached high school baseball for 11 years in Richmond and Chesterfield Co. He also coached high school girls softball for seven years in

Chesterfield and Hanover Counties and at a private school. He coached St. Gertrude High School in 2001 to an Independent League Championship and a bid in the state Private Schools Tournament.

Bailey owns a Bachelor of Science degree in History from VCU. He received a Masters in Education in Guidance Counseling and School Administration. He has served as a teacher/guidance counselor for Richmond Public Schools for the past 30 years. He began teaching hitting, fielding and throwing lessons at Batter Up Baseball/Softball Training Center in January 2000.



ANDREA ROHDE

ASSISTANT COACH
SECOND SEASON AT CNU

Rohde was the only CNU player to be named to the first team all-USA South in 2006. She was named to the utility position. She split time between

catcher, designated player and third base. Rohde hit .378, third best on the squad and tied for the team lead in hits with 48. She also led the team in home runs with four and RBI with 27. She hit .325 as a junior and was an honorable mention all-USA South choice and hit .352 with 35 RBI and was a first team All-USA South choice at catcher during her sophomore campaign. For her career, Rohde hit .338 with 157 hits, eight home runs and 90 RBI.



TODD WINEGRAD

ASSISTANT COACH
THIRD SEASON AT CNU

Todd Winegrad joins the CNU coaching staff for the Third time for the 2007 season.

Winegrad served as assistant coach at Hampton University for two years following a playing career as a pitcher for the Fox Hill Fastpitch Softball Association for six years. That team was one of the finest teams in the nation for many years before finally closing.

Winegrad's father, Don, is a member of the Amateur Softball Association (ASA) Hall of Fame.

Winegrad has two children, a daughter Brooke, 16 and a son Tyler, 7.

PREVIEWING THE 2008 CNU LADY CAPTAINS

A young team, with only one senior, propelled CNU back to 30-win territory and an NCAA bid in 2007, and most of that squad returns with even greater heights on its mind.

Coach Keith Parr welcomes back seven of the nine regular position players, as well as his entire, five-person, pitching staff. It all gives CNU hope for one of its best seasons ever. A year ago the Captains led the USA South in hitting with a .358 batting average, and were third in ERA at 2.57. Parr has every reason to feel those numbers will improve in 2008.

CNU won the USA South regular season title and defeated the defending national champions in the NCAA tournament. Parr sees even more progress ahead.

PITCHERS

In an unusual move in Division III in 2007, CNU had a five-person pitching staff, and they are all back.

For starters, there's senior Janet Fairchild, coming off one of the school's top seasons ever for a pitcher, including USA South Pitcher of the Year honors. It's no mean feat to have a season considered one of the best ever at CNU which has featured a long list of outstanding hurlers. Fairchild was 15-1 with a 1.62 ERA and will be the ace of Parr's staff.

Meanwhile, sophomore Kristen Bruce compiled a fine 11-4 mark in 2007 as the No. 2 starter, with a 3.92 ERA. Parr sees much improvement for her, along with juniors Lindsay Kelly and Sarah Tipton. Kelly was 3-0 with a 1.57 ERA, while Tipton put up a 3-1 mark, with a 3.38 ERA.

Maybe the biggest surprise of 2007 was the emergence of sophomore Kristen Rowe as a closer. Taking a page not used as much in softball as in baseball, Parr kept handing the freshman the ball in late-inning roles, and she responded with a national-record 14 saves.

CATCHERS

CNU's catching duties are in more than capable hands. Senior Margit Severin was the USA South first team all-conference catcher after leading CNU with a .457 batting average and 44 RBIs. On top of that she was outstanding behind the plate with just three errors. She'll be backed up by a pair of newcomers, freshmen Lauren Rowley (Lorton, Va.) and Taylor Patton (Clifton, Va.).

FIRST BASE

Sophomore Kristin Nickloy stepped in last season and responded with a .419 batting average, a pair of home runs, and 24 RBIs. She'll get the call in 2008, but three others could well see time in certain situations. Senior Hannah Brown has seen lots of action over the years. Sophomore Taylor Morgan received some playing time in her rookie season and freshman Ashley Walker could fill in as well with a potentially potent bat.

SECOND BASE

Junior Katie Moyers was the USA South Rookie of the Year in 2006 and a second team all-conference selection last season. She hit .411 with 24 RBIs in 2007 and gives CNU a veteran presence in the infield. Sophomore Brittany Harris was used often as a pinch hitter a year ago, and would be a solid back-up.

THIRD BASE

Junior Danielle Steel was a solid part of a platoon a year ago, hitting .256 and playing well in the field. Freshman Jessie Atkinson (Mechanicsville, Va.) will also play a role at the hot corner.

SHORTSTOP

Parr faced a major challenge in 2007 in trying to replace C.J. McQueen's contributions at this important position. Her speed, defense, and ability to get on base were a potent combination that figured to be difficult to replace. But sophomore Mary Kennedy stepped in without missing a beat. She was CNU's second leading hitter at .425, stole 28 bases in 30 tries, and was outstanding in the field. Junior Katie Moyers and sophomore Megan Morris will be her back-ups.

LEFT FIELD

Sophomore Megan Morris, a player with lots of potential, will get the call this season after hitting a fine .326 in her rookie year. Also battling for playing time will be sophomore Jamie Jansen who hit .378 in her opportunities and sophomore Audra Underwood, a .438 hitter during her 26 appearances. It gives Parr lots of options.

CENTER FIELD

Freshman Ashley Mani (Chesapeake, Va.) will take over in place of departed senior Melanie Hose. An outstanding defensive outfielder, her development at the plate will determine just how much of an impact she will have this year. Sophomore Jamie Jansen would be used here as well.

RIGHT FIELD

Freshman Allie Bartok (Purcellville, Va.) will use a strong left-handed bat to try to unseat senior Becky Bond, the incumbent, who hit .307 a year ago. Sophomore Renee Ashworth, who hit .333 before an injury sidelined her last season, also figures in the mix.

DESIGNATED HITTER

Senior catcher Margit Severin will once again be the DH when not behind the plate. Parr has quite a few options for the times Severin is catching.

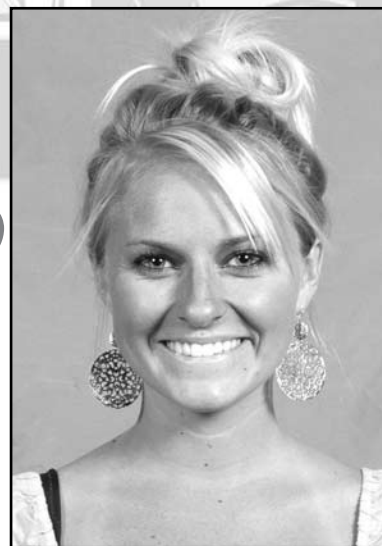

THE 2007 SEASON

30 WINS IS A HABIT

For the sixth time in the last eight years, CNU once again posted a 30-win season.

The Captains' 34-10 record gave CNU the coveted 30 victories overall for the ninth time in 13 years

Winning 30 games in a Division III softball season is a remarkable record that only a few teams achieve each year.

But for Christopher Newport it is simply old hat. Over the past 18 years, CNU's average record has been 30-12.

The Captains have posted eight 30-win seasons in the last 12 years and during that time the average record has been even slightly better at 31-11.

BACK TO THE NCAA

The Captains returned to NCAA play in 2007, making their fifth overall appearance.

CNU began the South Regional with a bang, defeating defending national champion Rutgers Camden, 10-3, behind three hits each from Kristin Nickloy and Margit Severin.

The Captains then dropped decisions to Lynchburg, 6-3, and Salisbury, 6-1.

PITCHER OF THE YEAR

CNU's Janet Fairchild capped her outstanding junior year by winning Pitcher of the Year honors in the USA South.

Fairchild posted a fabulous 15-1 record with a 1.62 ERA to take the honor.

She became the third Captain pitcher to win the honor. Vanessa Gray captured it in 2002 and 2004 with Michelle Kass being named in 2003. Four other CNU hurlers were named conference Player of the Year before a separate pitching honor was established. They were Mary Carpenter in 1992, Kerri Cobb in 1995, Jill Owens in both 1997 and 1998 and Donna Cerami in 2000 and 2001.

HONORING THE LADY CAPTAINS

Following their outstanding 34-10 season, numerous CNU players received post season honors.

In the USA South, four players were named first team all-conference. Junior pitcher Janet Fairchild was a first team selection, along with her Pitcher of the Year accolade. Junior catcher Margit Severin paced CNU with a .457 batting average, and improved from a second team choice in 2006. Junior Becky Bond was named in the outfield after a .307 season at the plate. Also, freshman Lauren Plevich was chosen as the DP. She hit .374 with five home runs.

Sophomore Katie Moyers followed

her Rookie of the Year season by being named second team all-conference at second base, while Mary Kennedy had a great freshman season and was chosen honorable mention at shortstop with a .425 batting average and 26 stolen bases in 29 tries.

Fairchild was also named first team all-Virginia Division II-III, while Severin, Plevich and Moyers were all on the second team all-state.

A BIG RELIEF

Freshman Kristen Rowe took on a role that had never been very prominent in CNU softball, that of a closer, but wound up making a huge impression.

Rowe posted 14 saves during the 2007 season. The previous school record had been three.

But not only was it a big school mark, it

broke the NCAA Division III record which had stood at 11, and came with two of equalling the all-time career record of 16.

NATIONAL NUMBERS

CNU came up big in several places in the final national NCAA Division III statistics.

Freshman Kristen Rowe set a national mark for saves with 14 and, of course, led the nation in that category. The second place total was five.

As a team, the Captains had a big year at the plate, with a .358 team batting average. That was good for sixth best in the nation.

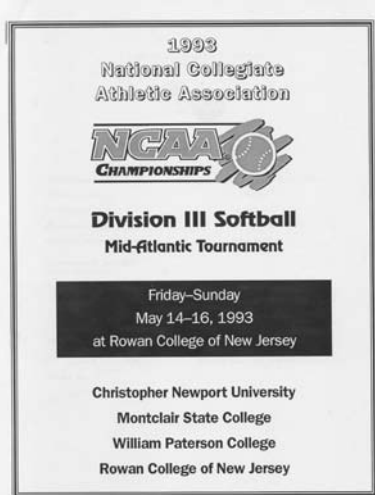
Their .773 winning percentage, based on a 34-10 record, was 21st.

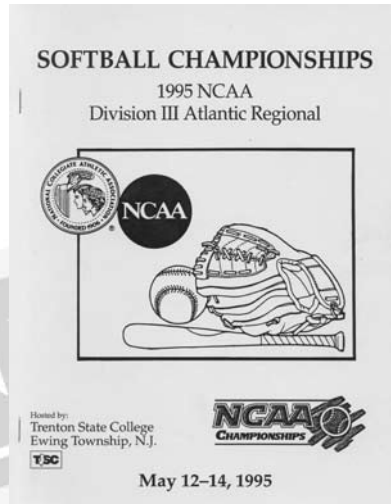

With the first pitch thrown on March 1, 2005, Christopher Newport entered a new era in its women's softball history.

The opening of Lady Captains Park gave the extremely successful program a fitting home, one of the finest in the region.

The state-of-the-art stadium includes a playing surface second to none, with drainage capabilities that will make rainouts a rare occurrence.

There are also bull pens adjacent to each dugout and a section of comfortable, major league stadium type chairback seating directly behind home plate.

The stadium is part of CNU's outstanding outdoor sports complex that includes a 3,100-seat football stadium plus top level venues for soccer, baseball, field hockey, lacrosse and tennis. There are also practice facilities for the sports within the complex.

DIRECTIONS TO LADY CAPTAINS PARK

From Chesapeake, Suffolk and Portsmouth

Follow routes to the Monitor-Merrimack Bridge Tunnel (I-664).

Cross the tunnel into Newport News and take Exit 5 to 35th Street and Warwick Blvd. (Route 60 West).

About 10 miles west of the tunnel take Exit 258B (Route 17 South, J. Clyde Morris Blvd.). Continue on J. Clyde Morris Blvd. to Warwick Blvd. where J. Clyde Morris becomes Avenue of the Arts. Follow that to a traffic circle. Go 3/4 of the way around the circle. Then make the next right turn onto Moore's Lane. After an S turn the stadium is on the right.

From Norfolk and Virginia Beach

Take I-64 West across the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel.

About 10 miles west of the tunnel take Exit 258B (Route 17 South, J. Clyde Morris Blvd.). Continue on J. Clyde Morris Blvd. to Warwick Blvd. where J. Clyde Morris becomes Avenue of the Arts. Follow that to a traffic circle. Go 3/4 of the way around the circle. Then make the next right turn onto Moore's Lane. After an S turn the stadium is on the right.

From Richmond and Northern Virginia

Take I-64 East. Exit at Exit 258 A (Route 17 South, J. Clyde Morris Blvd.). Continue on J. Clyde Morris Blvd. to Warwick Blvd. where J. Clyde Morris becomes Avenue of the Arts. Follow that to a traffic circle. Go 3/4 of the way around the circle. Then make the next right turn onto Moore's Lane. After an S turn the stadium is on the right.

From Northwestern Virginia

Travel to I-95 South the head South around Richmond on I-295 until it meets I-64. Then take I 64 East. Exit at Exit 258 A (Route 17 South, J. Clyde Morris Blvd.). Continue on J. Clyde Morris Blvd. to Warwick Blvd. where J. Clyde Morris becomes Avenue of the Arts. Follow that to a traffic circle. Go 3/4 of the way around the circle. Then make the next right turn onto Moore's Lane. After an S turn the stadium is on the right.

From Western Virginia

Depending upon your location travel to I-81 North until it meets I-64 East and then follow I-64 around Richmond (you may elect to take the by-pass I-295 in case of heavy traffic in downtown Richmond. Then take I 64 East. Exit at Exit 258 A (Route 17 South, J. Clyde Morris Blvd.). Continue on J. Clyde Morris Blvd. to Warwick Blvd. where J. Clyde Morris becomes Avenue of the Arts. Follow that to a traffic circle. Go 3/4 of the way around the circle. Then make the next right turn onto Moore's Lane. After an S turn the stadium is on the left.

If you are nearer to U.S. 58, take it East until it meets I-664 heading toward the Monitor Merrimack Bridge Tunnel. Cross the tunnel into Newport News and take Exit 5 to 35th Street and Warwick Blvd. (Route 60 West). After about five miles on Warwick Blvd. (Route 60) turn left on Avenue of the Arts at J. Clyde Morris Blvd. Follow that to a traffic circle. Go 3/4 of the way around the circle. Then make the next right turn onto Moore's Lane. After an S turn the stadium is on the right.

Prior to the opening of Lady Captains Park in 2005 the CNU softball team played its home games at four different locations over the years.

In 1997 Christopher Newport moved its softball team into a location on campus for the first time, at a temporary site behind the old Ferguson H.S., called Destany Park.

While a new facility was being constructed behind POMOCO Stadium, CNU played its 2004 home games at First Baptist Church on Warwick Blvd. in Newport News.

During the seven years at Destany Park the Lady Captains produced a 99-23-1 record, plus a 36-9 mark in Dixie Conference play, and then a 19-1 record, with an 8-0 mark in conference, at First Baptist Church.

THE HISTORY OF THE USA SOUTH

The USA South was formed in 1963, and was originally called the Dixie Conference, when six schools with similar philosophies of academics and athletics joined as the founding members. These colleges were: Charlotte College (presently UNC Charlotte), College of Charleston (S.C.), Methodist College, Lynchburg College, North Carolina Wesleyan College and St. Andrews Presbyterian College. The basis of the new athletic conference was that participation would be strictly amateur, thus no athletically related financial aid or athletic scholarships would be awarded. This philosophy still exists today.

The conference was originally affiliated with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), and remained with that affiliation until 1973. At that time the NCAA formed the Division III concept, which allowed membership only for non-athletic scholarship schools. The Dixie Conference joined this new arrangement, and in so doing, it became one of the first conferences to be accepted in Division III. From the beginning of the Division,

the Dixie Conference has been a leader in many areas, and has gained an outstanding reputation, regionally and nationally.

The conference sponsored athletic programs for men students only until 1983. The NCAA expanded its sponsorship to include women's programs on the Division III level in that year, and the Dixie Conference followed that lead by also including women's sports. Many of the members' teams have gained excellent recognition in these sports.

Each year the conference not only recognizes the participants for outstanding athletic achievements, but academic achievements are also emphasized. Those student athletes who maintain academic averages of 3.0 or better are named to the All-Academic team. This group annually averages nearly 400 in number.

The conference is presently led by Commissioner Rita Wiggs and President John Hill, of Shenandoah University.

Few, if any, Division III schools have had the overall success of the Christopher Newport athletic program.

Through the end of the 2006-07 season, CNU teams had won 12 national championships, either won or shared 150 conference titles and have produced an amazing number of individual accomplishments.

CNU athletes have won All-America recognition an amazing 516 times and have captured 64 individual national championships.

In the USA South Athletic Conference, CNU has won ten consecutive President's Cups and 16 of the last 24. Statewide, in Virginia, Christopher Newport has had the best win-loss record of any school in the state for six of the last ten years.

Nationally, CNU teams have made 59 NCAA appearances since 1982, not counting hundreds of individuals in track, cross country and golf.

Christopher Newport University

Fast Facts

Christopher Newport University is a small, selective public university. It offers baccalaureate programs through its College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the Joseph W. Luter, III School of Business, which earned international accreditation in 2005 by the world's top business accrediting organization – the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business. The University also offers a five-year bachelor's to masters program in teaching and graduate programs in applied physics and computer science and environmental science.

Location

CNU's 260-acre campus is located in Newport News, Va., two and a half hours south of Washington, D.C., less than an hour from Williamsburg and Virginia Beach, and just a few blocks from where the tidal James River flows into the Chesapeake Bay.

Student Profile

Forty-five percent of CNU's 4,800 students are male; 55 percent are female. Students come to CNU from every region in Virginia, 32 other states, and several foreign nations. The average high school GPA is 3.4 (on a 4.0 scale). The average SAT score is 1165 (critical reading and math sections).

History

Founded in 1960 as a two-year branch of the College of William and Mary, CNU became independent in 1977 and gained university status in 1991. Today, CNU is the youngest comprehensive university in the Commonwealth.

Class Size

With an average class size of 25 students, CNU has much smaller classes than most state universities. More than 90 percent of classes are seminars, and no classes are taught by graduate teaching assistants.

Facilities

With a \$400 million building campaign nearly complete, CNU's campus is bursting with new buildings and

improvements. Recent additions include state-of-the-art residential facilities, a \$16 million sports and convocation center, the new Ferguson Center for the Arts, and residential facility restaurants and stores. Opening in fall 2006 is a state-of-the-art student union; and an expansion project that will double the size of CNU's library is scheduled for completion in fall 2007.

Ferguson Center for the Arts

The \$60 million Ferguson Center for the Arts is the crowning jewel of Christopher Newport University. Teaching and learning are celebrated in the 1,700-seat Concert Hall, 440-seat Music and Theatre Hall, 200-seat Studio Theatre, classrooms, sound-isolated music practice spaces, rehearsal halls, dance studios, costume shops, lighting labs and set design studios. The Center's inaugural season, which began in September 2005, included world-class classical, pop, Broadway and dance performances, attracting more than 120,000 patrons and ticket revenue in excess of \$3.2 million.

Athletics

CNU athletes compete in 21 NCAA sports, including football, lacrosse and sailing. The University ranks fifth nationally in NCAA Division III Team Championships, and the school has produced 500 All-Americans.

Residence Halls

Nearly 3,000 students are housed in the University's state-of-the-art residential facilities that include four new resi-

dence halls and two new apartment complexes that win raves from students and parents, as well as architectural awards. New residential living includes CNU Village, a unique mixed-use development on campus that houses restaurants and stores that serve the entire community as well as students, faculty and staff. Every residential room has high-speed Internet, basic satellite cable TV, digital local phone service, 24-hour security, and electronic room access. All rooms are equipped with a microwave and mini-refrigerator or have kitchen access.

Faculty

Eighty-five percent of CNU's 932 faculty members hold the Ph.D. or highest degree in their fields. Fifty-five new faculty members have been added since 2003.

Cost

For in-state, full-time undergraduates, tuition and fees are \$6,460, and room and board is \$8,100. Christopher Newport University offers a variety of financial aid programs to help students and their parents pay for college; 43 percent of students receive some form of aid.

Campus Life

CNU's 100 clubs and organizations include academic organizations, fraternities and sororities, and special-interest groups. From Altered Xpressionz to Vibes of Our Vernacular, students are sure to find something to spark their interests.



Outstanding teaching with a strong commitment to undergraduate education and the liberal studies core are the hallmarks of Christopher Newport University. A dramatic transformation spanning the past decade has placed it among the United States' pre-eminent liberal arts universities. As the youngest university in the Commonwealth of Virginia's excellent system of higher education, CNU is getting better, not bigger.

CNU offers an unbeatable combination of great teaching, small classes and a commitment to placing students first, which means that the quality of teaching, advising and student life is the University's first concern. Classes average only 25 students, and are taught by faculty members – 85 percent of which hold a doctorate or the highest degree in their field – not teaching assistants.

These scholars desire to engage and challenge students inside and outside the classroom and are committed to playing an active role in campus life.
