A Look Ahead

THE OUTLOOK FOR 2008

Head Coach Ruth Keegan takes over for Kwame Lloyd for her first season at Christopher Newport. It's a changing of the guard that will hopefully lead CNU back to the NCAA Tournament. Lloyd left CNU for the top job at Vermont in February. Keegan brings a wealth of knowledge, having played at USA South rival Methodist in college, and coaching 11 seasons at Old Dominion.

Keegan was an All-American and the Dixie Conference Player of the Year during her time at Methodist. She also played five years for the Republic of Ireland national team.

Keegan takes over a squad that returns 14 players, including eight starters from a year ago. However, the leading scorer from last season, **Sam Ciaravino**, who had 11 goals and 25 points, left CNU and transferred to Vermont. But that doesn't mean Keegan has lost all of her scoring. Back are **Jenn Campbell**, **Amanda Peters**, **Emily Chesbro**, **Marica Betoney** and a wealth of others who have the ability to score. Not to mention nine newcomers.

GOALKEEPERS

Senior **Erin Wojtkun (Fairfax, VA/W.T. Woodson H.S.)** begins her final season as the potential starting goalkeeper. Wojtkun has put up some incredible numbers in her career, totalling a school best 33 wins and 20 shutouts to go along with a goals against average for her career below 1.00. Also back is junior **Dineen Sampson (Kennett Square, PA/Unionville H.S.)** Sampson took over the starting duties late in 2007 and finished 7-2 on the year with a 0.63 GAA, 32 saves and six shutouts.

DEFENDERS

Last year's defense stepped up its stinginess by allowing just 16 goals in 21 matches. **Jackie Hurley (Ridgewood, NJ/Ridgewood H.S.)** returns and will be looked upon along with **Ann Marie Latess (Stafford, VA/North Stafford H.S.)** as anchors of the defense. Latess had a break-out season in 2007 in the back, and was named Second Team All-USA south for her efforts.

Also returning is **Logan Boon (Fort Collins, CO/Rocky Mountain H.S.)**, **Megan Richard (Sterling, VA/Park View H.S.)**, **Brittany Rubin (Richmond, VA/Manchester H.S.)** and **Lindsey Lienau (Woodbridge, VA/Osborn Park H.S.)**. That group, along with newcomers **Alejandra Monteagudo (Alexandria, VA/Edison H.S.)**, **Vicki Fessler (Greenville, SC/Massaponax (VA) H.S.)**, and **Shelby Walters (San Antonio, TX/Woodson (VA) H.S.)** will all provide depth for Keegan in the back.

MIDFIELDERS

Gone is last year's leading scorer, freshman Sam Ciaravino. This year's midfielders could potentially be all freshman, or a combination of an upperclassman and the rest freshman. Once the freshmen play, and get some experience, this could be an explosive position. Returning is senior **Marica Betoney (Yorktown, VA/Tabb H.S.)**. Betoney scored four times and added four assists in 2007 and is capable of finding the back of the net. Junior **Brittany Revels (Spotsylvania, VA/Spotsylvania H.S.)** and **Chelsea Brown (Dover, DE/Caesar Rodney H.S.)** are the tallest players on the team at 5-11, and will see time in the midfield. Also returning is sophomore **Meghan Conheaney (Ridgewood, NJ/Ridgewood H.S.)** who scored four goals and led CNU with five assists last year. She could also see some time at forward. **Katie Jaywork (Wyoming, DE/Caesar Rodney H.S.)**, **Meghan Arbegast (Montclair, VA/Forest Park H.S.)**, **Lauren Fleming (Burke, VA/Lake Braddock H.S.)** and **Liz Nuesch (Crozet, VA/Western Albemarle H.S.)** all return for their second season. Newcomers **Elisa Haug (Centreville, VA/Westfield H.S.)**, **Caitlin Maat (Gainesville, VA/Battlefield H.S.)**, **Vicki Fessler (Greenville, SC/Massaponax H.S.)**, and **Alica Kurz (Midlothian, VA/Cosby H.S.)** will

all provide depth at the midfield position.

Nuesch, Revels and Fleming could all see time at the forward spot.

FORWARDS

The forward spot could very well be a bright spot once again this year. **Emily Chesbro (Fairfax, VA/Woodson H.S.)**, who was a defender her first two years, moves from the back to the striker position. She has the capability to score goals, as seen by her seven tallies last year. Chesbro was a First Team All-USA South and All-State choice in 2007 and she was also a Third Team All-South Region pick as a defender.

Joining her up top will be fellow junior classman **Jenn Campbell (Springfield, VA/Robert E. Lee H.S.)**. Campbell was a First Team All-USA South pick last year as well being named All-State. She scored 10 goals and finished with 24 points. The forward spot has a lot of experience, especially when you add in senior **Amanda Peters (Alexandria, VA/Edison H.S.)**. Peters, who could see action in the midfield as well, scored five goals and finished with 13 points in 2007. She will be looked upon to lead the team both on and off the field.

Sophomores **Britta McDonnell (Doylestown, PA/Gwynedd-Mercy Academy)** and **Katie Eacho (New Kent, VA/New Kent H.S.)** along with newcomers **Kendall Dishaw (Salem, VA/Salem H.S.)**, **Courtney McKay (Springfield, VA/Robert E. Lee H.S.)** and **Candace Thompson (Chesterfield, VA/Manchester H.S.)** will provide solid depth for Keegan.

SCHEDULE

Lloyd put together his final schedule, and what a demanding and tough schedule it should be.

The Captains, as usual, kick off the year on the road. This time they will play in the season-opening Blue Jay Classic hosted by Elizabethtown. CNU will play the hosts as well as nationally-ranked College of New Jersey on August 30 and 31.

Lloyd also created a home tournament September 5 and 6. He had brought in Cal Lutheran, Baldwin-Wallace and VA Wesleyan. The threat of Tropical Storm Hanna cancelled the event. CNU however was able to reschedule one of its two games,

a neutral site game against Cal Lutheran in Maryland was scheduled for the following weekend.

The day before the Cal Lutheran match, the Captains will travel to Lynchburg, another national power on the schedule. CNU will finally open its home schedule with three straight. Christopher Newport hosts Marymount on Sept. 19 and Roanoke the very next day. USA South play begins on the 24th as Shenandoah comes to town.

CNU will then head for Raleigh, NC to take on Meredith and Peace on Sept. 27 and 28 and return to Captains Field Oct. 1 for the first of another three straight home matches.

The Captains will host Salisbury on the first and then USA South foe Greensboro Oct. 4 before rounding out the home stand with VA Wesleyan on Oct. 8.

Four of the team's final six games will be played on the road. Methodist (Oct. 25) and Mary Baldwin (Nov. 1) are the final home games for Christopher Newport.

CNU will play at Averett (Oct. 18) and Ferrum (Oct. 19) and then head to St. Mary's (MD) on Oct. 26 and at NC Wesleyan on Oct. 29.

USA South Quarterfinals begin Nov. 4 with the Final Four on the seventh and eighth.

2007 Season Review

Double-digit wins seems to remain the top goal, along with winning conference titles. For six straight seasons, CNU's women's soccer squad has won at least 10 matches. It's also the eighth time since the program's inception in 1997 CNU has won 10 or more games in a season.

2007 marked the final season in Head Coach Kwame Lloyd's tenure at Christopher Newport. Lloyd left in early 2008 for the top job at the University of Vermont. Lloyd has left his mark at CNU by winning 91 games and having a winning percentage of .679 during his seven seasons. Lloyd guided his team to a 14-7 overall record and 8-1 in the USA South in 2007. CNU finished second in the USA South regular season standings and lost to Methodist in the USA South Tournament finals.

The Captains once again began the year on the road, playing at the Johns Hopkins Invitational. CNU kicked off the season with a 3-0 win over Guilford before dropping, then ranked 16th, Johns Hopkins, 4-1, on day two.

CNU then traveled to Richmond, VA to take on Chowan in a neutral site match, where the Captains came away with a 4-0 win.

The Captains hit a slight skid, dropping its first two matches at home, falling 2-1 to Mary Washington and 1-0 to Lynchburg.

CNU then reeled off four wins in their next five contests. The Captains knocked off USA South foes Shenandoah, Peace, Meredith and Greensboro. Christopher Newport dropped a 2-1 decision at Salisbury in between.

The Captains then lost back-to-back matches to ODAC rivals Washington & Lee, 1-0, and VA Wesleyan, 2-0, before getting back on the winning track.

Christopher Newport closed the regular season by winning five of its last six matches. The lone loss came on the road at Methodist, falling 1-0. That game, as it turned out, decided the regular season champion and the right to host the USA South Final Four.

CNU's last five wins came at the hands of Averett, Ferrum, St. Mary's, Mary Baldwin and NC Wesleyan.

The Captains finished second in the USA South regular season standings and hosted Shenandoah in the quarterfinals, dispatching the Hornets, 8-1.

Christopher Newport moved on to the semifinals, defeating Greensboro in the first overtime, 1-0.

In the championship game, the Monarchs scored the game's only goal in the 79th minute, taking the conference tournament title and advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

CNU was led by three First Team All-USA South selections. Freshman Sam Ciaravino, who led the team with 11 goals and 25 points, was a First Team choice in the midfield. She also became the first women's soccer player at CNU to be named First Team All-Region as a freshman. Ciaravino was also a First Team All-State pick and was named to the USA South's All-Tournament Team.

Junior striker Jenn Campbell was second on the team in goals with 10 and points with 24. She, too, was a First Team All-USA South pick. Campbell was also named Second Team All-State.

Also earning First Team honors was defender Emily Chesbro. She was also a USA South All-Tournament Team choice, named First Team All-State and was also selected Third Team All-South Region. Chesbro scored seven times and finished third on the team in points with 18, playing in the back.

Midfielder Amanda Peters, defender Ann Marie Latess and goalkeeper Erin Wojtkun were all named Second Team All-Conference.

Peters scored five goals and finished with 13 points. Latess, along with Chesbro, anchored the Captains defense that allowed just 16 goals in 21 games in 2007.

Wojtkun was 7-5 in goal with a 0.85 GAA, 48 saves and four shutouts.

Head Coach Ruth Keegan



Christopher Newport University Director of Athletics, C.J. Woollum, announced the hiring of RUTH KEEGAN as the school's new women's soccer coach on March 27, 2008.

"We are thrilled to have Ruth join our staff," Woollum said. "Her vast experience and knowledge of the game assures us that our women's soccer program will remain among the elite in Division III."

Keegan's coaching experience has come at several different levels. She served as an assistant at Old Dominion University from 1996-2006, and was the head coach of the soccer squad at Granby High School in Norfolk last season.

"I'm delighted to have the opportunity to lead the Christopher Newport women's soccer program," Keegan said. "I've always wanted to be a head coach at the collegiate level, and I look forward to continuing the great tradition of the program."

Keegan, a native of Dublin, Ireland, graduated from Methodist College in 1995, and was an All-American and Dixie Conference Player of the Year while with the Monarchs. Her playing experience also includes five years with the Republic of Ireland national team.

Keegan resides in Virginia Beach, Va., with her husband Kenny Edwards and their daughter Molly.





HILLARY CARNEY

Hillary Carney returns for her second season as an assistant, and her first in a full-time capacity.

Carney played three seasons for Lloyd and totaled 15 goals and 13 assists. She had her most successful offensive season in 2006 when she compiled 11 goals and six assists. In 2006,

Carney was named 2nd Team All-Region by D3kicks.com and was a Third Team choice by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. She was also chosen as a First Team All-State pick and a First Team All-USA South selection.

Tommy Vieten joins Head Coach Ruth Keegan's staff for his first season.

Vieten played four years for Head Coach Steve Shaw and is responsible for the goalkeepers.

As a player for the Captains, Vieten was an honorable mention all-USA South selection with a goals against average of less than 1.00 and recorded ten shutouts.

He was the soccer coach at Broad Run H.S. in 2005 and has been a top assistant at the Salty Dog Soccer Camps.

He will graduate in December with a degree in Biology with a minor in Chemistry and plans to pursue a career in Bio-Medical Engineering.

THE HISTORY OF THE USA SOUTH

The Dixie Conference, now known as the USA South Athletic Conference, was formed in 1963 when six schools with similar philosophies of academics and athletics joined as the founding members. These colleges were: Charlotte College (presently UNC Charlotte), College of Charleston (S.C.), Methodist College, Lynchburg College, North Carolina Wesleyan College and St. Andrews Presbyterian College. The basis of the new athletic conference was that participation would be strictly amateur, thus no athletically related financial aid or athletic scholarships would be awarded. This philosophy still exists today.

The conference was originally affiliated with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), and remained with that affiliation until 1973. At that time the NCAA formed the Division III concept, which allowed membership only for non-athletic scholarship schools. The Dixie Conference joined this new arrangement, and in so doing, it became one of the first conferences to be accepted in Division III. From the beginning of the Division, the Dixie Conference has been a leader in many areas, and has gained an outstanding reputation, regionally and nationally.

The conference sponsored athletic programs for men students only until 1983. The NCAA expanded its sponsorship to include women's programs on the Division III level in that year, and the Dixie Conference followed that lead by also including women's sports. Many of the members' teams have gained excellent recognition in these sports.

Each year the conference not only recognizes the participants for outstanding athletic achievements, but academic achievements are also emphasized. Those student athletes who maintain academic averages of 3.0 or better are named to the All-Academic team. This group annually averages nearly 400 in number.

The conference is presently led by Commissioner Rita Wiggs and President John Hill, of Shenandoah University.

From Chesapeake, Suffolk and Portsmouth

Take I-64 West across the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel. About 10 miles west of the tunnel take Exit 258B (Route 17 South, J. Clyde Morris Blvd.). Continue on J. Clyde Morris Blvd. to Warwick Blvd. Go straight ahead and follow the directions above beginning with Avenue of the Arts.

From Richmond and Northern Virginia

Take I-64 East. Exit at Exit 258 A (Route 17 South, J. Clyde Morris Blvd). Continue on J. Clyde Morris Blvd. to Warwick Blvd. Go straight ahead and follow the directions in the top paragraph beginning with Avenue of the Arts.

From Northwestern Virginia

Travel to I-95 South the head South around Richmond on I-295 until it meets I-64. Then take I 64 East. Exit at Exit 258 A (Route 17 South, J. Clyde Morris Blvd). Continue on J. Clyde Morris Blvd. to Warwick Blvd. Be in the far right hand lane and turn right onto Warwick Blvd. Go straight ahead and follow the directions in the top paragraph beginning with Avenue of the Arts.

From Western Virginia

Depending upon your location travel to I-81 North until it meets I-64 East and then follow I-64 around Richmond (you may elect to take the by-pass I-295 in case of heavy traffic in downtown Richmond. Then take I 64 East. Exit at Exit 258 A (Route 17 South, J. Clyde Morris Blvd). Continue on J. Clyde Morris Blvd. to Warwick Blvd. Go straight ahead and follow the directions in the top paragraph beginning with Avenue of the Arts. If you are nearer to U.S. 58, take it East until it meets I-664 heading toward the Monitor Merrimack Bridge Tunnel. Cross the tunnel into Newport News and take Exit 5 to 35th Street and Warwick Blvd. (Route 60 West). After about five miles on Warwick Blvd. (Route 60) make a left turn on Avenue of the Arts. Follow that to a traffic circle and go 3/4 of the way around to Shoe La. Make the first right turn, on Moore's La., to the parking area.

Few, if any, Division III schools have had the overall success of the Christopher Newport athletic program.

Through the end of the 2007-08 season, CNU teams had won 12 national championships, either won or shared 162 conference titles and have produced an amazing number of individual accomplishments.

CNU athletes have won All-America recognition an amazing 537 times and have captured 64 individual national championships.

In the USA South Athletic Conference, CNU has won 11 consecutive President's Cups and 15 of the last 24. Statewide, in Virginia, Christopher Newport has had the best win-loss record of any school in the state for six of the last 11 years.

Nationally, CNU teams have made 65 NCAA appearances since 1982, not counting hundreds of individuals in track, cross country and golf.
